Judge dismisses lawsuit against the City of Xenia; City committed to communicating with its Citizens.

Xenia, Ohio, 04/16/10: On April 14, 2010, the Greene County Court of Common Pleas dismissed the lawsuit filed against the City of Xenia. The City of Xenia Income Tax request known as Issue 7 will remain on the ballot for the May 4th primary election.
